


The GOD of gods and the LORD of lords <u>IS WITH</u> YOU! We pray for all who are in need of shelter!



NPCUCC Bus Trip to Holy Land in Orlando and Cocoa Beach




Tuesday, February 27—Thursday, March 1, 2018

#### **ECHO Mission Report and Update**

Recently we received a special *Thank You Report* from Meg Robel. Here are some excerpts from her report ...

"Thank you for your prayers and support during my time in



Thailand & Cambodia. I was blessed to have been able to work at ECHO's regional conference in Thailand before heading to Cambodia!"

"During my time in Thailand I got to visit ECHO's Seedbank and see how the seed growing and saving processes I learned during my ECHO Internship in Florida are practically implemented in rural areas! With over 20 nations represented at ECHO's conference, it was incredible to see the way God is using this organization to reach so many who were previously un-reached, to fight malnutrition, and to open up roads to the Gospel that were previously closed."

#### **Health Clinics in Cambodia**

"During our 5 days of clinics we were able to reach out to nearly 300 patients in 5 different rural communities that

largely lacked running water, electricity, and consistent access to healthcare."

"Among the many diseases that we diagnosed during the week were: HIV, Hepatitis, Dengue Fever, Malaria, Hypertension, Diabetes, Scabies and case after case of malnutrition. Many of these diseases, without follow-up healthcare, are sadly pretty disheartening conditions. This is when we were especially grateful for the hope of Christ that we were able to share with these 300 patients, as each had the opportunity to hear the Gospel and be prayed with after receiving care."

"A definite highlight of the trip was getting to return to the village of Neareay and learn more from the Boniao family who work with Moringa, Chaya, and other nutritious and medicinal plants in their community. Their approach to community health is inspirational, and the stark contrast of the health of the people in their rural village, vs. the many other villages we visited, was incredible."

"Words cannot express how thankful I am for the support I have received through prayer and generous donations to make this work possible. God is so good, and I am so thankful for what He is doing globally through both ECHO and Mission to the World." - Meg Robel

#### **Be Prepared for the next Hurricane**

Many of us found that we were not very well prepared with our Hurricane Disaster Plans once we learned that Hurricane Irma was headed our way. We all need to put our plans in place now, so we will be ready the next time something begins to threaten our safety.

Many of us, myself included, headed to a shelter for the first time ever. Some of us had good experiences, others were not as satisfied.

In the past our church tried to pair up folks who needed a place to go with folks who were willing to take people in. Hurricane Irma reminded us that this is not a good plan as many who "normally" stay and would take folks in, decided Irma needed to be taken seriously, and evacuated.

Back in 2005 following Hurricane Charley, our church Disaster Preparedness plan was created. Following Irma, our Trustees will be reviewing and updating our plan.

Thanks to Norma Beach, we now have in the church office applications for "Sarasota County People with Special Needs." From what I understand, persons fill out the form and send it to the County. They would then know that in the event of another Hurricane, you would need a place to go and need transportation to get there. This is especially important for our elderly and those in mobile home parks. Even if you are not sure you will ever need to use this program, it is a good idea to be signed up BEFORE just in case.

Call the church office and we'll mail a form to you.
