Dear Church Family,

Jesus is telling his disciples about the work ahead. Active faith, active Christianity is needed. This work, our mission is one that is filled with personal sacrifice.

Today I would like to share a lesson with you that the LORD brought home to me and close to my heart.

During my years at Seminary in Hungary there were plenty of outreach opportunities for the students. After the fall of Communism many new ministries were initiated by the Church and we were glad to serve wherever we were asked to.

Having arrived at my third year in Seminary, I was very busy and at the end of the year as students we had come to the point of being burned out. Several thesis were due and finally turned in. Many written and oral exams passed. Many hours of studying with friends, translating from German into Hungarian, etc. Just a little insight how busy we all had been. I was now done with it all and was looking

forward to a relaxing summer with nothing much to do. Well, God had other plans...

One afternoon one of my Professors came with a request: "Could you please go tomorrow (Sunday afternoon) and preach at the Clinic. My mother is very sick and I have to go and see her." I agreed but I have to admit not without murmuring in my heart. I complained at first but I knew better; for if God opened up this door for service there had to be a reason. Never dreaming what God was going to do...



Sunday came and I prepared a message about the ten Lepers being healed by Jesus and about the fact that only one came back to give him thanks. At the last minute I took a Children's Bible that had some great art work in it; illustrating the story. We had a blessed Service but I never used the Children's Bible for the illustration. I thought why did I ever bother taking it. After leaving the Chapel, I was approached by some people and asked if I could visit patients in their rooms and pray for them. The ones that were not able to attend the Chapel Service. I gladly agreed. After I had visited the last room, I was again approached by two individuals to visit a little girl that was very ill. Now

when someone says ill we many times don't comprehend that unless we see it. I entered this room and I was not prepared for what I was going to witness there. The girl was about eight or nine years old but her little frail body was more like the one of a four year old. She had a genetic disease that had left her hands and feet unformed. Her skin looked like it was burned. She had bandages all over and was sitting at a little table playing with a toy.

I sat down next to her praying hard on the inside and asking God for the right words. NOW, I could use the Children's Bible. God knew all along!

We opened it and she turned the pages; struggling page after page. We talked about the different pictures and we eventually came to the story of Jesus' Crucifixion. She looked at me and commented, "I know how Jesus must have felt. A lot of pain! I know what that is like, I have a lot of pain, too." It just made my heart ache. We prayed. We laughed. We played. I agreed to come back the next day for it was going to be her birthday. Her parents were not around and she was living in a Children's Home. So the following day another student and myself took a birthday present for her and had a nice little party.

Out of this encounter, a wonderful friendship and ministry developed and I still often think about our little friend, Anna Maria.

I am so glad that I went, that I obeyed God's call to serve that Sunday afternoon.

We have many ministry opportunities even now lining up here at our church. Please read this edition of our Navigator and cover all of our upcoming outreaches in prayer; without prayer nothing will succeed. Thank you all for your faithfulness in serving and supporting our many ministries. We could not do it without YOU!

In all a successful event. Thank you to all!





FYI about ECHO's Intern Program



The purpose of the ECHO Intern Program is to train college graduates in sustainable agricultural techniques for reducing hunger and improving the lives of the poor. Interns live and work at ECHO's 55-acre Global Farm in North Fort Myers for 14 months where they gain hands-on training in sustainable gardening techniques, tropical and subtropical plants, plant propagation, and farm management. They train 8 interns per year.

Among ECHO's 227 Intern alumni: 30% have served long-term doing international service work and 75% have done service-oriented assignments either domestically or internationally.

Current support for the Intern Program comes primarily from ECHO's committed donor base of individuals and churches. Thank you North Port for choosing to help equip a Christian young person with the skills needed to serve in agriculture related ministries. Thank you NPCUCC for being a blessing and provision to young people, like Meg, with a heart to serve Christ and reduce hunger.

Our total giving for ECHO's Intern Program so far is \$410.00 Thanks so much.




