

Sharon and Alden Miller have donated many books dealing with developing food and agricultural problems around the world. One book is "The Good Garden: How One Family went from Hunger to Having Enough" by Katie Smith Milway. Maria Luz and her family are poor struggling farmers. Her father leaves to find work so Maria is left to garden. A new teacher comes to town that teaches her how to garden. This is a simple story about a big issue: food insecurity. It is an introduction for children to be aware of this global issue.

"One Hen", also by Katie Smith Milway involves Kojo, who earns money by gathering firewood. He is given a small loan and he buys hens to sell their eggs. With the profits he buys more hens and goes to school. As he earns more, he lends money so others can leave poverty behind. This is a persuasive story of how reaching out to help someone with a small loan can have a big impact. Change can happen, one person at a time.






When we moved to Prescott, Arizona. I continued Operatic and Golden Oldies performances locally and in the Arizona Opera House.

"Thank you so much for your prayers and support this past year during my internship at ECHO! I am so grateful for the things that I was able to learn during my time there, both academically and spiritually, and I am super excited to put this new training into practice!

Moving forward now that my internship is complete, I will be returning to the same villages in Cambodia where I was so blessed to have the opportunity to serve during the summer of 2014. While there I will get to participate in medical clinics for the villages and people I came to love so dearly ... At the end of the week we will host a conference for medical students where I hope to present on the correlation between agriculture and malnutrition ...
